Frequently Asked Questions

What is Inari-LEARN?

The Inari-Led Educational Annex and Resident Network (Inari-LEARN) is a program for physicians-in-training to learn about diagnosis, treatment, and management of venous thromboembolism (VTE) through a multi-disciplinary curriculum curated to suit both interventional and non-interventional physicians.

With a combination of virtual, on-demand, and in-person events, program participants will achieve VTE excellence and gain a network of peers and mentors that will enhance their educational journey and elevate their career transition.

What is the length of the program?

Inari-LEARN runs on an academic year (July to June). Participants will be required to earn their engagement credits over the duration of the 12 months program.

How do I complete the program?

A total of 15 engagement credits are required for program completion eligibility. Credits will be tracked through the Inari-LEARN portal and progress will be monitored by the Inari-LEARN Program Manager.

If you have accrued the required engagement credits, you will be eligible to test out of the program. Test outs will take place once a year.

What does this program offer me after graduation? What are the benefits?

Graduates of the program will:

- Demonstrate advanced knowledge of the diagnosis, treatment, and management of VTE
- Earn a program completion certificate

In addition to clinical proficiency, the Inari-LEARN program will include **practical education** in areas such as: finding your career path, preparing for job interviews, business negotiation, navigating industry relationships, public speaking, and conducting clinical research.

You will have access to Inari's Clot Warrior Openings community; a network in which Inari representatives connect physician job seekers with open clinical positions around the country.

You will build a network of peers, faculty mentors, and industry contacts that you can maintain throughout your career as an attending physician.

Is there a fee for program participation?

There are no fees associated with Inari-LEARN. There is no cost to enroll, complete modules, or obtain program completion. Inari also covers the travel and expense costs associated with in-person attendance at the Annual Summit.

What happens if I cannot attend the in-person summit? Can I still be part of the program?

Although we believe that an in-person experience lends to a more impactful outcome, we understand the demanding schedules of physicians and are open to discussing alternate arrangements if you are unable to travel to the Inari HQ for program completion. Arrangements will be made on a case-by-case basis and are subject to approval by the Medical Education team.

What are the ways I can be involved with Inari-LEARN after I graduate?

As an Inari-LEARN alumni, you will be eligible to attend the annual summit at our HQ in Irvine, California for the alumni track of the event. There will also be potential opportunities to attend alumni events sponsored by Inari at various society meetings, as well as the potential to speak as an ambassador of the program at various events.
